General Show Rules

- 1. Exhibition is open to all daylily growers. Horticultural entries must have been grown, groomed and entered by exhibitor(s). Entries may not be entered by anyone not at the same physical address as the owner/grower of the daylily. (Exhibitors may not ask anyone to enter their flowers for them.)
- 2. Only ADS members are eligible to win ADS rosettes and other society sponsored awards. However, they may be new members who join at the show.
- 3. All entries will be received (checked by Classification Committee) between the hours of 8:00 am and 10:30 am. Late entries arriving after 10:30 am (acknowledged by Classification) may be entered For Display Only and will not be judged. Entries will not be placed in the display area after 10:30 am. No entry may be removed before 3:00 pm. Exhibits not removed by 3:30 pm will be discarded. Ribbons and awards, if not claimed at this time, will be made available at a later date upon request.
- 4. Uniform containers and official ADS entry tags will be furnished by Houston Hemerocallis Society.
- 5. Only members of the Placement Committee are permitted to place entries in the display area.
- 6. Judging will begin promptly at 11:00 am. Only Judges, Clerks, General Show Chair, Co-Chair, Judges Chair, Classification Chair and the Photographer will be allowed in the exhibition area during judging.
- 7. Show Officials of HHS will exercise all precautions for protecting exhibits but neither they nor Gethsemane Lutheran Church will be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

Horticulture Rules

- 1. All horticulture exhibits eligible for ADS rosettes and medals must be entered on scape.
- 2. Registered cultivars are to be entered on scapes whose overall height does not exceed 36."
- 3 All seedlings (including pre-registered cultivars) shall be severed as near the base as possible regardless of height. If the height of the seedling makes transport difficult, if not impossible, the exhibitor may trim the excess scape height preserving the cut portion of the scape. The cut portion of the scape must then be placed alongside the base of the container holding the entry.
- 4 A seedling having won an ADS rosette in any other show is not eligible.

- 5 Entry tags for seedlings must be marked with the word **SEEDLING** in the space for cultivar name. Names, numbers or any other identifying marks are not permitted on the visible portion of the folded tag.
- 6 *Eligibility* for exhibitors in the Youth sections shall continue through the end of the calendar year following the youth's eighteenth birthday. Youth exhibitors are limited to the Youth, Seedling, Popularity Poll and Achievement Medal Sections.
- 7 Cultivars listed on the official spider list must be exhibited in Section 6 unless they are: (1) part of a local collection, (2) a Youth Section exhibit, (3) registered as a multiform cultivar. (*See Multiform Classification Code on page 6 of this schedule.*)
- 8 Cultivars whose names are **not** listed in the ADS checklists or supplements may **not** be exhibited in any Division, Section, Class or Group where registered cultivars are specified. They must be entered in the seedling section (Section 10). They may also be entered in the Ophelia Taylor Horticultural Award (Section 12) in Class 2 (<u>Note: Section 12 is not applicable for this show</u>). They may also be entered in the Achievement Medal Award (Section 11), however, this option is only available to the hybridizer of the entry. The entry tag must be marked with the word SEEDLING in the space for cultivar name. Names, numbers or any other identifying marks are not permitted on the visible portion of the folded tag.
- Unusual Form cultivars, registered as such, must be entered in Section 7 and **only** those listed on the official Unusual Form cultivar list may be entered in Section 7 unless they are: (1) part of a local collection, (2) a Youth Section exhibit or (3) registered as a multiform cultivar (See Multiform Classification Code –Page 6)
- 10. Double form cultivars and polymerous form cultivars, registered as such must be entered in Section 5 and only those listed on the official Double Form cultivars list, or Polymerous Form Cultivars list, respectively, may be entered in Section 5, unless they are: (1) part of a local collection; or (2) a Youth section exhibit.
- 11. Only one entry per named class is allowed per household.

Multiform Classification Code for Shows

To assist Classification Chairs in determining where to place polymerous and multiform flowers, use the Multiform Classification Code shown below.

It is recommended that the Classification Committee use the ADS Online Registration Database to classify <u>each</u> registered cultivar by typing the cultivar name into the "Advanced Search" screen of the database. The appropriate Horticulture Division I and II show sections will be shown automatically. A complete list of multiform-registered cultivars will be made available to each show and classification chair.

Judging Standards for Accredited Shows

- 1. All judging of an accredited show will employ ADS standards.
- 2. All horticulture sections must be judged by ADS Exhibition Judges.
- 3. Each panel of judges shall be the final authority for each section and group in which it judges.
- 4. Only the Classification Chair has the authority to disqualify any entry that is damaged or does not conform to the schedule.
- 5. The appropriate ADS Scale of Points will be used for (1) Registered cultivars on-scape, (2) Seedlings on-scape and (3) Individual flowers of registered cultivars off-scape.
- 6. The ADS standard system of Awards will be used.
- 7. All scapes receiving the ADS rosettes or purple ribbons must score 95 or above by the ADS scale of points.
- 8. Registered cultivars will be classified as registered, by size, and by form; they will be grouped alphabetically within each section. No distinction is to be made between the classifications of diploids and tetraploids.
- 9. Each registered cultivar shall constitute a name class. A single entry may be given an award if the judges consider it a superior exhibit. An exhibitor may have only one entry per name class.
- Each seedling or pre-registered cultivar (a pre-registered cultivar is considered a seedling) shall constitute a class to be judged on individual merit. Each entry may be given an award if considered a superior exhibit.
- 11. If Division I, ADS Rosette eligible Sections 1-9, are subdivided or judged by more than one panel of judges, the purple awards must be point scored to determine a single winner, since there is only one ADS rosette for each of these Sections.

DIVISION I: HORTICULTURE ON-SCAPE

- Section 1: <u>Registered Extra Large Flowers</u> 7" or more in diameter Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name)
- Section 2: <u>Registered Large Flowers</u> $-4 \frac{1}{2}$ or more but under 7" Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name
- Section 3: <u>Registered Small Flowers</u> 3" or more but under 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name)

- Section 4: <u>Registered Miniature Flowers</u> less than 3" Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name)
- Section 5: <u>Registered Double and Polymerous and Multiform Flowers</u> Class A: Extra Large – 7" or more in diameter

& Large $-4 \frac{1}{2}$ " or more but under 7" in diameter

Class B: Small – 3" or more but under 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter

& Miniature - less than 3" in diameter

Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name)

- Section 6: Registered Spider Flowers Spider Ratio 4.0:1 or greater Class A: Extra Large – 7" or more in diameter & Large – $4\frac{1}{2}$ " or more but under 7" in diameter
 - Class B: Small 3" or more but under 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter & Miniature – less than 3" in diameter Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name)
- Section 7: <u>Registered Unusual Form Flowers</u> Groups A – Z (alphabetically by cultivar name.

Section 8: Youth - Registered cultivars any size, form or pattern

Section 10: <u>The American Daylily Society Achievement</u> <u>Medal</u> 3 scapes of a single seedling or pre – registered cultivar severed as near the base as possible (*An exhibitor may have multiple entries in this section*.)

Section 11: <u>Ophelia Taylor Horticulture Award</u> Not applicable to this exhibition Section 12: <u>Collection, Registered</u> 3 scapes, one each of 3 different cultivars, in separate containers.

Section 13: <u>Collection, Seedlings or Pre-Registered</u> 3 scapes, one each of 3 different cultivars, in separate containers.

DIVISION II: HORTICULTURE OFF-SCAPE

Section 1: <u>Collection, Registered</u> Individual flowers severed from scape, any size or form, displayed on 12" X 18" Styrofoam boards, green in color. Six blooms per board.

Section 2: Collection, Seedlings or Pre-Registered Cultivars Individual flowers severed from scape, displayed on 12" X 18" Styrofoam boards, green in color. Six blooms per board. **DISPLAY ONLY. NOT TO BE JUDGED.**

DIVISION III: EDUCATION

- Section1 A display of materials available through membership in the American Daylily Society. Section 2. Invitations to join the American Daylily Society.
- Section 3. A list of local sources of daylilies and local daylily Clubs.
- Section 4. Culture sheet and pertinent materials on growing daylilies.

DIVISION IV: DESIGN – "70 Years of Friends and Flowers"

- Section 1. Eligible for the ADS Tricolor Rosette
 - Exhibit must include **all** fresh plant material with daylilies dominating. **Weathered wood** is not permitted.

Class A. "Grandma's Glories"	36" tall X 24" wide X 18" deep
Class B. "Barbie and Ken's Doll House"	36" tall X 24" wide X 18" deep
Class C. "The Next Generation's Dreams"	12" tall X 12" wide X 12" deep

Design Rules

- Exhibitors are allowed only one entry per class. Entry reservations are required by contacting Design Chair, Marti Zuber, @ <u>martizuber01@gmail.com</u>. Reservation deadline date is April 19, 2024.
- **2.** Daylilies must be the PREDOMINANT flower in ALL arrangements.
- 3. Arrangements in Section1. Classes A and B will be staged in niches 36" tall X 24" deep X 18" deep. Fabric_drapes furnished by the exhibitor. Niches may be furnished by the show sponsors or exhibitors may furnish their own. Arrangements in Class C will be staged on a table using a space 12" tall X 12" wide X 12" deep. A niche may or may not be used as designer chooses. Designs should fill the space without exceeding the specified dimensions in each class. Arrangements will be displayed on long tables.
- **4.** Designs must be arranged by the exhibitor.
- 5. Tricolor classes require ALL FRESH PLANT MATERIAL. Weathered wood may not be used.
- 6. Section 1 must have **THREE CLASSES** with **FOUR ENTRIES** in each class to qualify for the Tricolor Award.
- **7.** A 3" X 5" card of explanation may be attached to the show entry tag.
- 8. Plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
- **9.** Judging in the Design Division will be performed by the National Garden Clubs, Inc. standards.

10.

The exhibitor who wins the Tricolor Award must be a member of ADS or must join at the show.

- **11.** The Tricolor Award winner is eligible to compete for the ADS Tricolor Medal, provided the winner is an ADS member or joins at the show.
- 12. <u>The Tricolor entry must have 95 points or above to receive the top</u> <u>award.</u>

MAJOR AWARDS FOR HORTICULTURE

The ADS Purple Award is awarded to each blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or more within Sections 1-9 of Division I.

The ADS Section Rosette (Best-in-Section Rosette) is awarded to the most outstanding Purple ribbon winning entry in Sections 1-9 of Division I.

The ADS Best-in-Show Rosette is awarded the best of the AHS Rosette winners in Sections 1-9 of Division I

The ADS Sweepstakes Rosette is awarded to the exhibitor winning the most blue ribbons in Division I, Sections 1-9. In the event of a tie, purple ribbons will be counted. If a tie should still exist, red, then yellow awards will be counted.

MAJOR AWARD FOR DESIGN

The ADS Tricolor Rosette is awarded to the best design in Division IV, Section 1, scoring 95 points or more. This entry qualifies to compete nationally for the ADS Tricolor Medal.

ADS STANDARD SYSTEM OF AWARDS

Judging of each cultivar in each class shall be done by the American Daylily Society system of awards.

One First (Blue) which must score 90 or above.

One Second (Red) which must score 85 or above.

One Third (Yellow) which must score 80 or above.

For registered cultivars, only one blue, red and yellow may be awarded in a given name class. For seedlings, each exhibit in the section is judged on its own merit thus is an award-eligible class.



SPECIAL HORTICULTURE DIVISION AWARDS

The ADS Achievement Medal is awarded to the originator of each entry of 3 scapes of the same seedling in Division I, Section 11 scoring an average of 90 points or more, and which in the opinion of the judges, shows adequate merit and <u>distinctiveness</u> as compared with existing cultivars. Entries must be entered by number assigned by the Classification Committee. Each of the judges on the panel assigned to judge the entries will point score each scape individually. The score sheets will be returned to the General Show Chairman and Tabulation Committee chair who will tabulate the scores. Scores will **NOT** be official until they have been verified by the Exhibitions Chair or the Exhibitions Committee.

The ADS Award of Appreciation, a rosette, may be given at the discretion of the local show committee, not the judges, to one or more noncompetitive educational exhibits in Division III to show appreciation for the significant efforts involved.

Houston Hemerocallis Society Trophies will be awarded to the ADS Rosette winning exhibits in each of sections 1-9 of Division I, ADS Best-in-Show, the exhibitor winning the ADS Sweepstakes Rosette and to the exhibitor winning the Tricolor Rosette.

Houston Hemerocallis Society Blue Rosette will be awarded to the best exhibit scoring an average of 90 points or more in Division 1 Sections 12 & 13, and Division II Section 1.
